## PREAMBLE

Whereas, Department of Botany, PDEA'S Waghire College of Arts, Commerce and Science (WCS), Saswad and Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Waghire College, Saswad, both located at Pune District Education Association's (PDEA), Waghire College Saswad, Tal: Purandar, Dist: Pune -412301. The College was established in 1972 and spread over of 11 acres. College has actively involved in various research activities and also received DST-FIST grant from Department of Science and Technology.

Whereas, Techniche Engineering Private Limited (INDUSTRY) is engaged in providing engineering consultancy services in India as well as abroad.

Whereas, both WAGHIRE COLLEGESASWAD and INDUSTRY, now

- Recognizing the importance of research and development in the area of environment, life sciences, health, chemical sciences as well as imparting industrial training to the engineering/technology/sciences students, etc.
- Appreciating the need for creation of large reservoir of highly qualified manpower in all fields
- Desiring to club their efforts by pooling their expertise and resources

Intend to form a nucleus for promoting awareness in India about the research areas associated with different type of expertise areas mentioned above.

Now, therefore in consideration of the mutual promises made herein and of good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which both WAGHIRE COLLEGE SASWAD and INDUSTRY hereby acknowledge, WAGHIRE COLLEGESASWAD and INDUSTRY hereby agree to sign a memorandum of understanding (MOU).

The intent for signing this MOU is to set-up the collaboration for research projects, industrial training and imparting education through specifically designed courses in various areas of environment, health, chemical sciences, entrepreneurship and personality development. Prin. Dr. Sushama Bhosale and Dr. Vidya Patankar (Assistant Professor) from WAGHIRE COLLEGESASWAD and Dr. Medha Sakpal & Mr. Nilesh Sakpal (Directors) from TEPL & TIPL jointly acknowledge the collaboration.

### ARTICLE 1: SCOPE OF THE MOU

This MOU details the modalities and general conditions regarding collaboration between WAGHIRE COLLEGE and INDUSTRY for enhancing, within the country, the availability of highly qualified manpower in the areas of environment, life sciences, health, chemical sciences without any prejudice to prevailing rules and regulations in WAGHIRE

COLLEGE and INDUSTRY without any disregard to any mechanism evolved and approved by the competent authorities under Govt. of India in so far as such mechanism applies to WAGHIRE COLLEGE and INDUSTRY. The areas of cooperation can be extended through mutual consent.

#### ARTICLE 2: SCOPE AND TERMS OF INTERACTIONS

Both WAGHIRE COLLEGE and INDUSTRY shall encourage interactions between the Engineers, Scientists, Research fellows, faculty members and students of both the organizations through the following arrangements:

1. Exchange of personnel through deputation as per the rules of the respective institute, for limited periods as mutually agreed upon;
2. Participation in conferences and seminars;
3. Practical training of WAGHIRE COLLEGE students at INDUSTRY
4. Joint guidance of student projects/thesis in the fields mentioned above and other areas of national interest at WAGHIRE COLLEGE by INDUSTRY on mutually agreeable terms
5. INDUSTRY would accommodate BSc and MSc students in such a number that INDUSTRY deems convenient to it for the purpose of imparting industrial training
6. INDUSTRY may depute its personnel as visiting faculty at WAGHIRE COLLEGE to teach any of the regular course, specialized topics or design and conduct specifically designed courses as per mutual agreement between both the above mentioned parties.
7. INDUSTRY may seek assistance/guidance of WAGHIRE COLLEGE faculty member/s in product/process modification, modernization, trouble shooting, etc., and would allow the industrial visits of students for half/full day to provide them with an exposure to various software tools, etc.
8. INDUSTRY may showcase its business activities at the seminar/workshop/conference, etc. at WAGHIRE COLLEGE on mutual agreement.
9. INDUSTRY may avail library, Internet, computational facilities at WAGHIRE COLLEGE for student research projects at the college.
10. No Intellectual Property Rights can be secured for any part of the work which will be decided with mutual consent.
11. If the outcome of a project related to product development, process technology and design etc. which involves matter of secrecy and concern with security of the State and the Country, the same will not be allowed for publication/printing in any form such as Electronically/verbal, etc. If the outcome of a project results into an intellectual property,

for which rights can be secured, it will be decided on case-to-case basis. Similarly, sharing of expenditure in securing such rights and income accrued through royalty etc by the parties under the law will be decided on case-to-case basis after mutual consultation.

12. Research supervisors from both the organizations will be the corresponding authors in any publication resulting from the collaborative work. All the efforts put by the student/s as a part of this MoU will be accounted for by way of reporting the work in thesis and/or paper publication except the part for which IPR needs be claimed. In special cases:

I. If the student working towards his / her degree, he / she is usually the corresponding author, with the guide being the last author.

II. If the work is not towards any degree, then of course, research guides / personnel from the industry would be the corresponding author.

13. Neither of the supervisors will publish the work carried out under this MoU without knowledge of the other.

14. In any of the activities mentioned above, wherever financial aspects are involved, amount, payment conditions, etc. would be spelt out clearly before starting the activity.

15. The association will extend to the psychology department wherein collaboration for projects and internships will be decided.

16. The industry shall organize various talks, sessions for personality development and health awareness for the students.

### **ARTICLE 3: SHARING OF FACILITIES**

1. WAGHIRE COLLEGE and INDUSTRY shall make provisions to share their respective important R&D facilities in order to promote academic and research interaction in the areas of cooperation.

2. WAGHIRE COLLEGE and INDUSTRY shall permit the sharing software and other materials and components developed in-house in the areas of cooperation, if permissible within the rules governing the two institutions. However, responsibility for safety of software and other materials during the exchange will rest on respective Head of academic department/section.

3. WAGHIRE COLLEGE and INDUSTRY shall provide access to the library facilities to scientists, members of faculty and students as per the prevailing rules and norms in the respective institutes.

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#### **ARTICLE 4: CO-ORDINATION OF THE PROGRAMME INCLUDING FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS**

1. The collaborative program between WAGHIRE COLLEGE and INDUSTRY shall be coordinated by a coordination committee appointed by Directors of both the Institutes.
2. Financial arrangements for each specific collaboration will be decided on a case-to-case basis and brought on record in each case after due approval from heads of both the Institutions.

#### **ARTICLE 5: EFFECTIVE DATE AND DURATION OF MOU**

1. This MOU shall be effective from the date of its approval by competent authorities at both ends.
2. The duration of the MOU shall be for a period of 1 year from the effective date.
3. During its tenancy, the MOU may be extended or terminated by a prior notice of not less than six months by either party. However, termination of the MOU will not in any manner affect the interests of the students/faculty/scientists who have been admitted to pursue a program under the MOU.
4. Any clause or article of the MOU may be modified or amended by mutual agreement of INDUSTRY and WAGHIRE COLLEGE.

#### **ARTICLE 6: IPR & Conflict of Interest**

Rights regarding publications, patents, royalty, ownership of software/design/product developed etc. under the scope of this MOU, shall be decided by the two parties by mutual consent.

Both the parties hereby disclose no conflict of interests in their research pursuits.

#### **ARTICLE 7: CONFIDENTIALITY**

During the tenure of the MOU, both WAGHIRE COLLEGE and INDUSTRY will maintain strict confidentiality and prevent disclosure of all the information and data exchanged under the scope of this MOU for any purpose other than in accordance with this MOU.

Both WAGHIRE COLLEGE and INDUSTRY shall bind their respective personnel who come into possession or knowledge of any confidential information not to disclose the same to third parties without written approval of the disclosing party or use such confidential information for any use other than intended under this agreement.

Further both WAGHIRE COLLEGE and INDUSTRY shall put in place adequate and reasonable measures to keep and store confidential information secure so as to prevent any unauthorized use.

CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION shall mean any proprietary information, data or facts belonging to PARTIES collectively or severally, disclosed by the disclosing party under this agreement or any subsequent agreement, whether in writing, verbal or electronically, irrespective of the medium in which such information is stored, which is marked confidential or with any other words having similar meaning by the disclosing party, or specifically agreed to be kept confidential by the parties, or declared or identified so by the disclosing party before such disclosure or during the discussions. However confidential information shall not include any data or information which:

- a) is or becomes publicly available through no fault of the receiving party,
- b) is already in the rightful possession of the receiving party prior to its receipt of such data or information;
- c) is independently developed by the receiving party without reference to the confidential information of the disclosing party
- d) is rightfully obtained by the receiving party from a third party or is in the public domain
- e) is disclosed with the written consent of the party whose information it is, or
- f) is disclosed pursuant to court order or other legal compulsion, after providing prior notice to the disclosing party.

#### **ARTICLE 8: AMENDMENTS**

Any amendment and/or addenda to the AGREEMENT shall be in writing and signed by the PARTIES hereto and shall only after such execution be deemed to form part of the AGREEMENT and have the effect of modifying the AGREEMENT to the extent required by such amendment or addenda.

#### **ARTICLE 9: RESOLUTION OF DISPUTES**

This agreement shall take effect and be construed in accordance with the Laws of India and be subject to the jurisdiction of the courts at Pune, Maharashtra, India.

The dispute or difference whatsoever arises between PARTIES in relation to or in connection with this AGREEMENT both the parties shall first try to resolve the dispute/difference amicably between themselves, failing which the matter shall be referred to and settled through arbitration. The arbitration proceedings shall be held in accordance

with the provision of Indian Arbitration and Reconciliation ACT, 1996. The venue of arbitration shall be New Delhi and Language of arbitration shall be English.

#### ARTICLE 10: MISCELLANEOUS

1. The headings and sub-headings are inserted for convenience only and shall not affect the construction of this Agreement.
2. Both WAGHIRE COLLEGE and INDUSTRY shall not, during the term of this Agreement directly or indirectly, solicit or offer employment or engagement to any of the personnel of other party without the prior consent in writing of that other party.
3. No failure to exercise and no delay in exercising, on the part of a Party, and right, remedy, power or privilege hereunder shall operate as a waiver thereof, nor shall any single or partial exercise of any right, remedy, power or privilege hereunder preclude any other or further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right, remedy, power or privilege. The rights, remedies, power and privileges herein provided are cumulative and not exclusive of any right, remedies, powers and privileges provided by law.
4. After this Agreement has been signed, all preceding understandings/negotiations and correspondence pertaining to it shall become null and void.

## Online Workshop Report: Understanding PCOS

**Date:** April 20, 2022

### Objective:

Techniche Imunita (TIPL) is committed to enhancing awareness and understanding of significant health issues affecting women. In alignment with this commitment, we conducted an online session focused on Polycystic Ovary Syndrome (PCOS), a prevalent endocrine disorder affecting women across various age groups.
